Reasons to Contact Us

- Your baby is not doing what other babies her age are doing.
- Your baby feels very “stiff” or “floppy”.
- Your baby doesn’t make sounds or respond to sounds during his first year.
- Your child isn’t saying words by age 2.
- Your child isn’t saying sentences by age 3.
- Your child has more trouble paying attention or following directions than others her age.
- Your child is accident-prone.
- Your child is not interested in people or has a hard time playing with other kids.
- Your child gets upset with minor changes in routine.
- Your child repeats, echoes everything he hears but shows little understanding of the words.
- Your child has an unusually high or low activity level.
- It is hard for others to understand what your child says.
- Your child is overly sensitive to what he sees, touches, tastes, hears or smells.
- Your child is having difficulty in her daycare or preschool.
- You want to connect with other families.
- You are feeling overwhelmed caring for your child with special needs.
- You need information, resources or access to benefits.
- **Your gut tells you something is not quite right!**
